The main character in this story is an orphan who grows up on the streets of Warsaw during the holocaust. He steals to supply food for himself and others that he comes into contact with throughout the story. His ability to run symbolizes the trait that helps him survive during this time of religious prosecution. His running also symbolizes how his mind runs (craziness) and how this allows him to adapt to his surroundings as a survival mechanism. His adaptations include becoming a gypsy, a Jew, and even a stone Angel. He became a gypsy (Misha Pilsudski) when his friend Uri realized he needed an identity to give him a meaning to his life. He became a Jew (Misha Milgrom) in order to become a part of a family in the ghetto. And, during the time in the ghetto, he became a stone angel in order to be able to stand at attention throughout the night so he wouldn't fall and be beaten by the Jackboots.
